NGAA-East sponsored an outing to the Cold War Museum® on Tuesday October 17, 2017. The Cold War Museum® is dedicated to education, preservation, and research on the global, ideological, and political confrontations between East and West from the end of World War II to the dissolution of the Soviet Union.

The tour started outside the museum with an introduction of the former Top Secret signals intelligence base located outside Gainesville, VA. The museum is in one of the former Vint Hill Farm Station buildings used during the Cold War by the US Army, the National Security Agency, and the Central Intelligence Agency to intercept and interpret coded messages.
